### **Concept Note**

Rajiv Gandhi University (RGU) is located at Rono Hills in Doimukh, Papumpare District, Arunachal Pradesh, and is approximately 350 Km from Guwahati (GAU) airport, 200 Km from Dibrugarh (DIB) Airport, and 50 Km from Lilabari (IXI) Airport. The nearest Railway station is Gumto (GMTO), approximately 06 Km. Naharlagun/ Itanagar (NHLN) Railway station is 14 Km, and Harmuty (HMY) located in Assam is 15 Km away from Doimukh.
