The Conference

Theme

The author may either choose from the herein-above mentioned alternatives or exercise his/her discretion whilst finalizing a topic. It must however, be in conformity with the theme of the conference.

Conference Format

The conference will take place over a span of two days. It will commence on **March 31**st, **2023** with the inaugural ceremony, hosting keynote addresses by eminent speakers from India and other countries, to be followed by presentation of papers in the notified technical sessions. The second day, *i.e.*, **April 1**st, **2023** shall continue with presentations before the respective panels. It will conclude with the valedictory ceremony.

APPLICANT INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Abstract: Each applicant must submit an abstract of around 250-300 words outlining the proposed paper and send it by e-mail to iclct2023@gmail.com no later than February 28th, 2023. The Abstract must be accompanied with a covering letter containing the given information: Title of the Paper, Name of the Author/Co-Author, Designation, Institutional Affiliation and Contact Details. There should be a minimum of five keywords appended to the Abstract.
- 2. *Date of Communication of Acceptance of Abstract:* After reviewing the abstracts received, the organizing committee will notify the applicant of its acceptance or otherwise, by **March 5th**, **2023.** The decision of the said committee shall be final.
- 3. *Date of Submission of Paper:* Applicant(s) selected by the organizing committee to present paper in the conference must submit the complete paper by March 25th, 2023.
- 4. *Paper Format & Word Limit:* All papers must be typed in MS Word with Times New Roman font on an A4 size paper and 1" margin on all sides, font size 12 and line spacing of 1.5. The word limit may range between 4,000-6,000 words including headings and properly formatted footnote citations (end notes are not permissible). ILI Rules of Footnoting (Indian contributors)/Any other suitable mode of Footnoting used as a norm in the research community of a country (Foreign Nationals), may be followed. [They would be standardized at the time of selection for publication].
- 5. *Partcipation:* The Conference is open for participation alone, without paper presentation for anyone intending to hear the deliberations that transpire during the two days of the conference. In furtherance of the same, a minimal participation fee stipulated herein-below is required to be paid. The participant shall be **entitled to a certificate in the capacity of an attendee**.
- 6. *E-Mail:* All Papers/abstracts/expression of interest for mere participation must be submitted by e-mail to: iclct2023@gmail.com
- 7. *Number of Co-Author(s):* Besides the author, **only one co-author is permissible.**

- 8. *Date of Registration:* Registration fee for presentation or participation, as the case may be, must be paid by March 10th, 2023. The same is non-refundable. Details pertaining to the mode of payment shall be communicated separately *vide* an email.
- 9. *Attendance:* Participants must attend the conference on both days to receive the certificate of presentation/participation.
- 10. *Publication Opportunities:* Selected papers will be published in an edited book (with ISBN). They may also be accommodated in SSOL's in-house Journal namely, Sharda Law Review (SLR), a bi-annual, blind peer-reviewed publication. The wisdom of the Editors making such selection shall be final and cannot be subjected to any subsequent dispute.

All certificates shall be sent by post. E-certificates will be mailed to all international participants.
