Guidelines for Abstract submission

- 1. An abstract is a single paragraph (not more than 250 words) without subheadings, indentation or references.
- 2. It should be a detailed summary of your work that states the problem, the objectives, the methods used, and the major results and conclusions.
- 3. It should be single-spaced in 12-point Times New Roman.

Guidelines for chapter submission

- 1. The Chapter including the abstract and footnotes should conform to a word limit of 3000-6000 words.
- 2. The contributions submitted for publication in the book must neither have been previously published nor currently, be under consideration for publication elsewhere.
- 3. Co-Authorship of one person other than the author is allowed.
- 4. The manuscript's first page must contain only the name of the author(s) and his/her institutional affiliation, professional information, contact details including email and phone number, type of manuscript, and any other relevant information.
- 5. All submissions must be sent in .doc or .docx format.
- 6. The body of the manuscript shall be in Times New Roman, font size 12 with 1.5 line spacing and justified alignment. All Sub-headings must be in capitals, bold and font size 14.
- 7. Citations shall be in Times New Roman, font size 10, and justified alignment.
- 8. Reference must be provided as "endnotes" in OSCOLA format.
- 9. Similarity only up to 10% will be accepted. Submissions should not have any AI-generated content.
- 10. The abstract and full paper must be submitted to <u>islrgreencriminology@gmail.com</u> with subject "Submission: Green Criminology".
