Participation and Eligibility

Students pursuing either a 3-year or a 5-year LL.B. degree from any Law School/College/University recognized by the Bar Council of India are eligible to participate. Team members must be bonafide students of the institution they are representing.

Teams participating in the Competition must be duly authorized by the moot court society/ Faculty-in-charge/ Dean of their respective Institute to participate. (Registration Form is attached with the pdf)

Once registered (after Final Registrations), a Team will not be permitted to vary their composition in any manner.

No University/institution can send more than two teams for the Competition

Language: The official language for the Moot Court Competition is English

Dress Code

For Boys- Black Pants, White Shirt with Black Blazer.

For Girls- Black Pants, White Shirt with Black Blazer or White Churidar Suits with Black Blazer or White Sari and Black Blazer.

Team Composition

The participating team shall comprise a minimum of two (2) and a maximum of three (3) members. In a team of two (2) members, both the members shall be designated as 'Speakers' and one of the two Speakers shall be considered as 'Researcher' (which is to be notified at the time of Final Registration). In a team of three (3) members, two members shall be designated as 'Speakers' and the third member of the team shall be designated as a 'Researcher'.

Each team will have a team code. Teams shall not disclose their identity or that of their institution or city etc. Such disclosures will invite penalties including disqualification. The decision in this regard

shall be at the discretion of the Organizing Committee.

The Organizing Committee reserves the right to bar any team from participating in the Competition.

Competition Structure: The Competition shall be held in physical Mode and shall consist of Preliminary Rounds, Quarter-final Rounds, Semi-Final Rounds and Final Round. The top 8 teams from the preliminary rounds shall qualify to participate in the Quarter Finals. Winners of the Quarter- Finals will proceed to Semi- Finals. Winners in the Semi-finals will qualify for the Final Round.

Teams shall argue cases against each other. For the said purpose, fixture of teams will be decided by draw of lots prior to each round of the competition.

There shall also be a Researcher Test on 17/04/2024.

Memorial Submission

MOOT PROPOSITION IS ATTACHED AT THE END OF THE PDF

- Each team participating in the Competition must prepare one Memorial on behalf of the Petitioner(s)/ Appellant(s)/Applicant(s) and one on behalf of the Respondent(s)/Defendant(s).
- Each team must send the soft copies of each side of the Memorials (One (1) in MS Word .doc/.docx format and One (1) in .pdf format) for evaluation by 10th April, 2024, 11:59 PM IST to iilmcs@gmail.com with the subject “[Team Code]
- Memorial for Appellants and Respondents”. All the files shall be sent in one mail only. The file names of the electronic copies of the Memorials must contain only the Team Code and the side is represented in the following format: e.g., (for Team Code: 10) 10-P or 10-R, ‘P’ being for “Petitioner” Memorial and ‘R’ for “Respondent” Memorial and so forth.
- Cover Page of Hard Copy of Memorial of Petitioners’ Side shall be in Blue Color and of Respondents’ Side shall be Red Color.
- Soft copies of Memorials submitted beyond the deadline of 10th April, 2024, 11:59 PM IST shall incur a penalty of 05 Marks for each day of delay till 13th April, 2024, 11:59 PM IST.
- Any soft copy of the Memorials received after 13th April, 2024 will be subjected to immediate disqualification thereafter.
- Further, each Team shall submit Four (5) Hard Copies for each side of the Memorial by 13th April, 2024 either by hand or by post addressed to Office of School of Law, IILM University, Greater Noida, Plot No. 16-18, Knowledge Park – II, Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh 201306.

Each memorial shall necessarily consist of only the following sections:

- Cover Page with Team Code mentioned on Top Right
- Table of Contents
- List of Abbreviations
- Index of Authorities
- Statement of Jurisdiction
- Statement of Facts (not exceeding two pages)
- Statement of Issues
- Summary of Arguments (not exceeding two pages)
- Written Arguments (not exceeding 20 pages)

- Prayer (not exceeding 1 page)

Each memorial shall only have the following on its Cover Page:

- The team code on the top right-hand corner of the Cover page
- The name and place of the forum
- The relevant legal provision under which the Court is approached
- Name of parties and their status
- Memorandum filed on behalf of Petitioner(s)/Appellant(s)/Applicant(s) or Respondent(s)/Defendant(s).

The Memorials shall be ‘Spiral Bound’. The Memorials must bear a Cover Page in conformity with the following scheme:

- a. The team code on the top right-hand corner of the Cover page
- b. The name and place of the forum
- c. The relevant legal provision under which the Court is approached
- d. Name of parties and their status
- e. Memorandum filed on behalf of Petitioner(s)/Appellant(s)/Applicant(s) or Respondent(s)/Defendant(s)

The Memorials shall be ‘Spiral Bound’. The Memorials must bear a Cover Page in conformity with the following scheme:

Petitioner(s)/Appellant(s): Blue

Respondent(s): Red

Memorial Format

- All the pages of the Memorial must be of A4 Size with an equal margin of 1 inch on each side. The text font for the ‘Main Body’ must be Times New Roman, Size 12, with 1.5 Line Spacing. The alignment should be justified.
- The text font for the ‘Footnotes’ must be Times New Roman, Size 10, with 1.0 Line Spacing. Character Spacing should not be condensed in any manner.
- Footnotes must not be explanatory.
- Teams shall cite authorities in the Memorial using footnotes following the Harvard Bluebook 20th Edition and the footnoting must be uniform throughout the Memorial.

Exchange of Memorials

The exchange of Memorials will take place on the day of physical registration i.e., 17th April, 2024. Teams are strictly forbidden from making any annotations on the exchanged Memorials.

Teams are also prohibited from reproducing photocopies of such Memorials.

The Memorial of the opposing team must be returned to the Court Officers upon the completion of each Round.

Structure of the Competition

A. Researcher's Test: (17/04/2024)

- The Researcher's Test shall be conducted on 17/04/2024.
- The format of the test shall be based on MCQs.
- Every Team member designated as a Researcher has to be present at the time of the Researcher's Test.
- Questions for the Researcher's Test will be formulated based on the factual circumstances of the Moot Proposition, as well as relevant legal principles and statutes.
- The Researcher's Test is exclusively open to the designated researchers of the Participating Teams.
- If case there are only two members in a team, either one of them may partake in the Researcher's test.
- The duration of the test will be 60 minutes.
- In the event of a tie, the score of the memorials will be used to ascertain the "Best Researcher".

B. Oral Round Procedures:

General Procedures:

The oral rounds shall be conducted in offline mode at the venue and shall comprise four rounds in total:

- Preliminary Round
- Quarter-Final Round

- Semi-Final Round
- Final Round

Procedure for Oral Submission

- Before the beginning of the Oral Rounds, each Team shall inform the Court Officer:
 - The minutes for which each speaker namely Speaker-1 and Speaker-2 shall argue before the Bench,
 - The minutes reserved for rebuttal (in case of Petitioner) or sur-rebuttal (in case of Respondent), are subject to the discretion of the judges.
- Each team will get a total of 30 minutes (in Preliminary and Quarter-Final Rounds) and 40 minutes (in Semi-Finals and Final Round) to present their case. This time **will include the time reserved for rebuttal or sur-rebuttal**, subject to the discretion of the Judges.
- The division of time between the two speakers is up to the discretion of the team. In case of the Preliminary & and quarterfinal rounds, each team shall be allotted 30 minutes to present their case, subject to a minimum of 12 minutes and a maximum of 18 minutes per speaker. This shall include time allotted for arguments advanced, rebuttal and sur-rebuttal. For the semifinals and final round, each team shall be allotted 40 minutes to present their case, subject to a minimum of 16 minutes and a maximum of 24 minutes per speaker. This shall include time allotted for arguments advanced, rebuttal and sur-rebuttal.
- The oral arguments should be strictly confined to the issues presented in the memorial.
- The researcher must be present with the speakers during the oral rounds. Maximum scores for the oral rounds shall be 100 points per speaker per judge.
- The oral rounds shall be judged on the following criteria:

Preliminary Round (18/04/2024)

- There shall be One (1) Preliminary Round. The Team will argue for the side (Whether Petitioner or Respondent) decided through draw of lots
- Each team shall be allotted 30 minutes to present their case, subject to a limit of minimum of 12 minutes and a maximum of 18 minutes per speaker. This shall include time allotted for arguments advanced, rebuttal and sur-rebuttal.
- The memorial scores shall be used as a tie-breaker in case of a tie.

Quarter-Final Rounds (18/04/2024)

- A total of eight (8) Teams shall proceed to the Quarter-Final Round from the Preliminary Round, which shall comprise of four (4) fixtures.
- In the Quarter-Final Rounds, each Team shall argue from the side allotted to them on the basis of the draw of lots.

- Each team shall be allotted 30 minutes to present their case. This shall include time allotted for arguments advanced, rebuttal, and sur-rebuttal, subject to a limit of a minimum of 12 minutes and a maximum of 18 minutes per speaker.
- The Quarter-Final Rounds shall be similar to knock-outs, i.e., the team with the lesser score shall be eliminated. The Winning Teams in each of the four Quarter-Final Rounds shall advance to the Semi-Final Rounds.

Semi-Final Rounds (19/04/2024)

- The Semi-Final Rounds shall consist of the top four teams, who have secured the higher score in their respective Quarter-Final Rounds against their opponents.
- In the Semi-Final Rounds, each Team shall argue from the side allotted to them on the basis of the draw of lots.
- Each team shall be allotted 40 minutes to present their case, subject to a minimum of 16 minutes and a maximum of 24 minutes per speaker. This shall include time allotted for arguments advanced, rebuttal and sur-rebuttal.
- The Winning Team from each of the two Semi-Final Rounds shall advance to the Final Round.

Final Round (19/04/2024)

- For the Final Round, the Teams shall argue on the side allotted to them on the basis of the draw of lots.
- Each team shall be allotted 40 minutes to present their case, subject to a minimum of 16 minutes and a maximum of 24 minutes per speaker. This shall include time allotted for arguments advanced, rebuttal and sur-rebuttal.
- The Winner of the Final Round (i.e., the team obtaining a Higher Score) shall be adjudged as the 'Winner of the Competition'.

NOTE: Use of any Electronic Gadgets is strictly prohibited during Researcher's Test and Oral Rounds. Non-compliance with the Rules shall lead to immediate disqualification.

Compendium

Submission of a compendium is not mandatory. If a team decides to submit a compendium, a hard copy must be submitted as per the following guidelines:

- The Compendium can be presented at the discretion of the Judge. If permitted, it must happen 10 minutes before the commencement of the rounds.
- The compendium for the book/case or any other resource shall be cited on the first page of the resource and the relevant pages only. For instance, for citing a paragraph(s) from a case X v. Y, the first page of the case, followed by relevant pages, shall be cited for this part of the compendium.
- The responsibility of creating a comprehensive, accessible compendium folder lies with the teams. Teams must also provide an index for their compilation.
- In the interest of ensuring anonymity, the material passed as a compendium to the Bench must not contain any sign, symbol, or text that reveals the identity of the institution to which the team belongs.

Scouting

Teams shall not be allowed to observe the Oral Rounds of another team unless they have been officially knocked out of the Competition. Scouting is strictly prohibited. Scouting by any team shall entail immediate disqualification.

Adherence to Anonymity

- During the Oral Rounds, participating teams shall not state their names or the name of the Institution to which they belong or any personal details and instead must use the Team Code allotted to them.
- The team shall not disclose their identity anywhere in their written Memorials and instead should use the Code allotted. Failure to comply with any of the conditions stipulated above shall result in immediate disqualification of the team. The decision of the Organizing Committee in this regard would be final.

Awards

The winners shall be awarded Cash prizes, Certificates, Trophies, and other perks which may be announced at the later stage of the Competition. There shall be awards under the following categories:

1. Winning Team: Rs 61000/-
2. Runner Up Team: Rs 31000/-
3. Best Speaker/Mooter: Rs 5000/-
4. Best Researcher: Rs 5000/-
5. Best Memorial: Rs 5000/-

Accommodation and Food

- The University will **NOT** be providing accommodation for participants during the moot court competition. However, there are several hotels located in close proximity to the university campus, offering various lodging options to suit your preferences and budget. For assistance or recommendations regarding nearby accommodations, feel free to contact the organizing committee.
- Food shall be provided to all the teams for the aforementioned duration of the competition.

Miscellaneous Rules of the Competition

Participating Teams are expected to conduct themselves in a manner befitting the legal profession and maintain the appropriate decorum of the courtroom during the proceedings.

The Organizing Committee retains the right, at its sole discretion, to take appropriate action for any

unethical, unprofessional, and wrongful conduct throughout the Moot Court Competition.

The Organizing Committee's decision concerning the interpretation of these rules or any other matters relating to the Moot Court Competition shall be final and binding. If there is any situation not covered by these rules, the decision of the Organizing Committee shall be conclusive.

The Organizing Committee reserves the right to amend, modify, or repeal any of the rules if required and as deemed appropriate. Participating Teams shall receive adequate notice of any/all such amendments or modifications to the rules and regulations.

MOOT COURT PROPOSITION

1. Rohan Mehra is a 28-year-old entrepreneur. He completed his MBA in Marketing from the Indiana Institute of Management (a prestigious institute) (Batch 2017–19) in Tucknow, Ultra Pradesh, Indiana. After completing his graduation, Mr. Rohan Mehra went abroad for a year to learn the art of perfumery in the renowned state of Francis (a country in Europa). After returning, he started his own company of perfumes with the name 'Scents'. The company has built a good reputation in the Indiana market in a very short span of time.
2. Riya Singh, a 27-year-old marketing executive, completed her education at the Indiana Institute of Technology (Batch 2017-19) in Tucknow, Ultra Pradesh. After graduating, she got a campus placement from the college itself in a renowned company, 'TCJ', where she has been working since then as a software developer at a good pay.
3. During their time at the Indiana Institute of Technology, both used to work on many class projects and field assignments and soon developed a strong sense of liking for each other. Riya was mesmerised by Rohan's charm and ambition, whereas Rohan was awestruck by Riya's beauty and intelligence. They both confessed their love to each other on 10th March 2018 and became a popular couple in the whole institute.
4. Their love was intact even when Rohan went abroad to study the art of perfumery in 2019. The two used to have long conversations over voice calls, instant messages and video calls for over a year. After returning to Indiana, their relationship became stronger than ever both physically and emotionally.
5. While in relationship Rohan used to take Riya with him to all the social gatherings and functions. On the night of November 20, 2022, Rohan took Riya to his brother's marriage, where she met Rohan's family and relatives. Rohan introduced Riya to his mother, where Rohan's mother, after meeting Riya, asked both of them, "When will you two throw a similar function for us?". Listening to the question, Rohan and Riya looked at each other and smiled, and then Riya said, "Soon." Listening to the same Rohan, he did not respond.
6. Also, Rohan used to introduce Riya to his friend circle, thereby bringing their relationship into the knowledge of their social circle. Rohan, during a party when he was in a drunken state, was asked by his friends Rishi and Radha, who were married, about the future of his relationship with Riya, to which Rohan replied, 'Riya will make a perfect wife'. The same conversation was narrated to Riya by Radha without the consent or knowledge of Rohan. Rohan was unaware of any such communication being made to Riya by Radha.
7. Rohan and Riya started living together. Rohan pitched an idea to Riya that she should work with her and develop an app for his perfume company 'Scents' so that they can sell their perfumes directly without involving other shopping applications like Amacon, Flipmart etc. Riya liked the idea and started working on developing the app for it, but at the same time, iterated that she would not quit her job.
8. As they were in a relationship, no formal written contract was executed between the two, and thus the entire agreement was based on the exchange of messages on WhatsApp (an instant messaging application).
9. Over a WhatsApp chat on 13th May 2023, both of them agreed on a payment structure in which Riya will get a lumpsum amount of Rs 10 Lac once the application is developed. However, the mode and timing of payments were not clearly defined.
10. As the work progressed, the parties experienced disagreements relating to the development of the application, with Rohan claiming that some crucial aspects of the project were left as Riya was not able to balance her job and working on the application at the same time, thereby leaving Rohan frustrated.

11. As a consequence of the same, Rohan denied adequate payment as promised in the WhatsApp chats on the ground of a deficiency in services rendered, thus annoying Riya. But Rohan calmed her down so that their relationship was not affected.
12. On November 17, 2023, Riya asked Rohan to marry her, which Rohan denied and thereby called off the relationship.
13. Meanwhile, feeling deceived and emotionally distressed, filed an FIR alleging that Rohan had engaged in sexual intercourse with her on the pretext of marriage, and now he was refusing to fulfil his promise. Rohan denies any expressed promise relating to marriage made by him, whereas Riya contends that an implied promise of marriage was made and thus she gave her consent for sexual intercourse on the pretext of marriage.
14. Following the same, medical tests were performed and it was confirmed on the basis of reports that sexual intercourse took place frequently between Rohan and Riya. However, nothing was concluded on the matter of consent.
15. As a consequence of the same, Rohan was arrested. Rohan was presented before the magistrate.
16. Rohan was denied bail and was later acquitted for the charges by Trial Court of Tucknow. The trial court held that, both Riya and Rohan were in consensual relationship, therefore, Rohan cannot be held liable for Rape.
17. Riya filed an appeal against the trial Court's Order in High Court of Ultra Pradesh. The High Court reversed trial Court's judgment and convicted Rohan for the charge of Rape on the pretext of Marriage. Rohan then filed a Special Leave Petition in Supreme Court of Indiana against High Court's order.
18. Rohan further asked the court to take into consideration that his family had been looking out for a bride on marriage platform Jeevanteresaathi.com and thus, he and Shreya (the girl who agreed to marry him through Jeevanteresaathi.com) have decided to get married and that his fundamental Right to Marry enshrined by the Constitution of Indiana would be violated.
19. However, Riya also filed a suit for breach of contract. To which Rohan alleges that conversations on WhatsApp are not formal in nature. He also contends that WhatsApp chats does not form a valid contract.
20. Apart from this, Rohan has also challenged the constitutional validity of Section 375 of the Indiana Penal Code, 1860, entitling only women to file a case on the ground of consent on the pretext of marriage and the same not available to men.
21. The Hon'ble Supreme Court of Indiana, for the sake of convenience, decided to hear all the cases on the same day with the following issues:

ISSUES

- Whether the Special Leave Petition is Maintainable in the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.
- Whether the agreement entered into by Rohan and Riya on WhatsApp amounts to a valid contract recognizable by laws in India?
- Whether the consent for sexual intercourse was given by Riya only the pretext of marriage and does it amount to rape under Section 375 of Indian Penal Code.
- Whether a denial of bail for Rohan for the purpose of his marriage would amount to an infringement of his fundamental right under the Constitution of India?

NOTE:

1. The laws in the Union of India and the Union of India are in pari materia.
2. The Counsels representing both sides are required to address the issues that are specifically mentioned in the moot problem.
3. The Counsels may formulate their own sub-issues in the above-mentioned issues.
