



Theme 2: Emerging Challenges and the Constitution's Adaptation



## **SUBMISSION GUIDELINES**

All submissions shall be in English and .Docx format (Word file) only

The paper should be typed in MS-Word Document format, Times New Roman, font size 12 & 1.5 spaced. The main heading must be bold with font size of 14. The footnotes must be typed in Times New Roman, font size 10 & 1 spaced. Citation should be Blue-Book 21st edition.

The abstract with a word count of 250-500 words is to be attached with the registration form in the link given below. The keywords are restricted to 05(five) and the same will not count towards the word limit.

Full paper submission must have 1500 to 2500 words, excluding the footnotes, abstract and keywords.

The cover page shall include the title of the paper, name, designation, address, e-mail ID, contact number, and the name of the college/firm/ University, along with the address of the authors. In case of co-authorship, the cover page shall include details of both authors. Neither the part of the submission should have been published earlier nor should it be under consideration for publication elsewhere.

Plagiarism up to 20% including the citations is permitted and the Al usage must be limited to 5%.
