




Call for Papers

The submitted full papers will undergo a double review process by an expert panel. Authors are expected to make necessary revisions and submit the revised paper within a week of receiving feedback. At least one author must present the paper online or offline at the conference. Submitted full papers must have a plagiarism rate of less than 10%.
