About Jamia Hamdard

The history of Jamia Hamdard begins with the establishment of a small Unani clinic in the year 1906 by Hakeem Hafiz Abdul Majeed, one of the well-known practitioners of Unani System of Medicine of his time. Hakeem Hafiz Abdul Majeed had a vision of making the practice of Unani Medicine into a scientific discipline so that Unani medicines could be dispensed in a more efficacious manner to patients. He gave the name "Hamdard" to his venture which means "sympathy for all and sharing of pain". His illustrious son, Hakeem Abdul Hameed, carried forward the philosophy and objectives of Hamdard in independent India. Even at the time of partition of India in 1947, Hakeem Abdul Hameed was dreaming of setting up a complex of educational institutions which would concentrate on highlighting the contribution of Islam and Islamic culture to Indian civilization and development of Unani medicines for curing diseases.

On 28th August, 1948, Hamdard, which was a commercial enterprise at that time, was converted into a Wakf, with the object of giving effect to Islamic teachings of public charity including health and education. In 1964, Hamdard National Foundation was

created with a view to receive and disburse the profits earned by Hamdard (Wakf) Laboratories. For setting up a complex of research and educational institutions, Hakeem Abdul Hameed purchased a piece of land in Tughlaqabad area (South Delhi) which was hardly inhabited in those times. In order to implement and execute the objects of Wakf as enshrined in the Wakf deed, Hakeem Abdul Hameed and his Muslim associates, established several institutions for teaching and research as given below.

In 1962, Hakeem Abdul Hameed set up the Institute of History of Medicine and Medical Research with the object of promoting education and research in the history of medicine, besides appraising the principles of medicine. In 1963, Hakeem Abdul Hameed and his Muslim friends and associates set up Indian Institute of Islamic Studies with a view to promote the study of Islamic Culture and Civilization especially its contribution to Indian society and culture. In 1963, Hamdard Tibbi College was set up in Gali Qasim Jaan, Old Delhi. It was later shifted to Jamia Hamdard Campus in 1980 to provide education in Unani Medicine to students so that the heritage of Unani Medicine largely available in Arabic and Persian is passed on to the students of next generation. In 1972, Hamdard College of Pharmacy was set up with the objective of providing education and training in all branches of pharmacy. The year 1989 saw the fulfilment of the dream of Hakeem Abdul Hameed when Jamia Hamdard was given the status of Deemed to be University by the Ministry of Human Resource Development on 10th May, 1989. All the above-named institutions set up by Hakeem Abdul Hameed and his friends and associates were amalgamated into Jamia Hamdard.

Jamia Hamdard was inaugurated by Late Shri Rajiv Gandhi on August 01, 1989. In his impressive speech, the Prime Minister lauded the efforts of Hakeem Abdul Hameed in setting up institutions of learning which were emerging in the form of a "Deemed to be University". Jamia Hamdard was conceived as a seat of higher learning in Unani Medicine, Islamic Studies, Biosciences, Pharmacy, Nursing and other areas of knowledge by its founder as a means of fulfilling the objects of the wakf. Over a period of last ten years, Jamia Hamdard has emerged as an outstanding institution of higher learning with distinct and focused academic programmes. Graduate programme in Law, Information Technology & Computer Applications and Post-graduate programmes in Law, Information Technology, Computer Applications, Business Management, Physiotherapy and Occupational Therapy have been started in the last few years.

Submission Guidelines

HILSR Law Review prefers submissions with the following length limits (including all text, footnotes and appendices).

- Long Article (6000-8000 words): In this category of submissions, the journal expects a detailed analysis of the issue(s) undertaken by the author, to the extent of a detailed analysis of the surrounding legal scenario at domestic and international levels and/or cross-jurisdictional analysis, and concrete conclusions and suggestions (through a reform-oriented research methodology), indicating a specific way forward.
- Short Article (4000-6000 words): In this category of submissions, the journal expects analysis of contemporary legal issues from single or multiple legal perspectives, i.e., a detailed examination of legal developments and/or happenings using single or multiple legal perspectives as (a) basis. In this category, if at all an author attempts to analyse debatable issues, i.e., issues that could be addressed through two perspectives of being justified or not justified, authors are encouraged to employ multilateral perspectives for the purposes of analysis, and then provide a conclusion in furtherance of such analysis.
- **Commentary (1500-3000 words)**: A comment allows the author to critique any recent/landmark judicial pronouncement, legislation or a pending bill. The focus of a comment should be on a relatively recent pronouncement or legislation. If a comment is on a judgment, it shall be called a 'Case Comment'. If a comment pertains to a Recent Legislation/Pending Bill, it shall be called as a 'Legislative Brief'.

• **Book Review (1500 words):** In this category of submissions, a critical review may be undertaken of a book-related to trade law and allied fields, including the issues explored and related arguments of the author.

All submissions are required to be addressed to the Managing Editor, *HILSR L. Rev.* and emailed to **hilsr.lawreview@jamiahamdard.ac.in.**

- ➤ All submissions should be sent with a covering letter indicating the Name of the Author, Institutional Affiliation, Contact Details and the Topic of the paper. Name and designation pf the author(s) **should not** be mentioned in the manuscript submitted by the author(s).
- ➤ All submissions must be accompanied by a 200-word abstract and a minimum of 3 Keywords.
- All submissions must be accompanied by List of References/Bibliography appended at the end of the manuscript. (The word count of References/Bibliography shall be excluded from the word limit requirement of paper).
- ➤ HILSR L. Rev. shall allow a maximum of two authors. Co-authored papers should give details about both the authors.
- ➤ The Board shall consider the authorship and designation mentioned in the cover letter during submission as final and correct, unless otherwise intimated by the author/s.
- ➤ It shall be the responsibility of the Author to intimate the Board regarding any change in designation during the period in which the paper is being processed.
- ➤ No changes or revisions in the paper shall be entertained after publication.
- ➤ The Author shall be required to send a duly signed and dated copy of an undertaking in the prescribed format (provided by the Editorial Team) along with the submission.



Formatting Guidelines

Authors must adhere the following formatting guidelines:

- Paper Title [Times New Roman, 16 Points, Bold, All Caps, Centre Align]
- Name of Author(s) [Times New Roman, 12 Points, Italics, Centre Align]
- Abstract Caption [Times New Roman, 11 Points, Centre Align]
- **Abstract Text** [Times New Roman, 11 Points, Italics, Justify, 0.5-inch indent on both sides]
- **Keywords caption** [Times New Roman, 12 Points, All Caps, Left Align]
- **Keywords text** [Times New Roman, 12 Points, Justify, Single Line Spacing]
- **Heading Level 1** [Times New Roman, 13 Points, Centre Align]
- Heading Level 2 [Times New Roman, 12 Points, Italics, Left Align]
- **Heading level 3** [Times New Roman, 12 Points, Left Align]
- Main Text [Times New Roman, 12 Points, Justify, 1.5" Spacing]
- Name of the case in the main text [Times New Roman, 12 Points, Single Line Spacing, Italics]
- Footnotes Text [Times New Roman, 10 Points, Single Line Spacing]



Footnoting and Citation Style

Authors must adhere to Indian Law Institute (ILI) Rules of Footnoting & Citation for the manuscript and bibliography. Weblink for the same: https://ili.ac.in/cstyle.pdf



Screening Process

On the receipt of draft, the Managing Editor shall allocate the work to Editorial Team. Each draft received by the Editorial Team shall be screened thoroughly in 8 stages:

- 1. Stage 1/Preliminary Screening: Initially, an internal screening process shall be carried out to ensure that the submitted drafts align with the general appropriateness of the work and are conceptually and theoretically sound. During this phase, the Editorial Team (Board and Student Committee) verifies that the drafts adhere to basic requirements, including citation style, formatting, and word limits. The preliminary screening shall be done by the Assistant Editors and the Student Committee.
- 2. Stage 2/Plagiarism Check: Following the initial screening, the drafts are subjected to a plagiarism check, with a maximum allowable similarity index of 15%. This requirement must be complied by the Authors before making their draft submission. The plagiarism check and processing of the reports shall be done by the Student Committee under the supervision of Assistant Editors.
- **3. Stage 3/Peer Review Stage:** Upon successful completion of the above two phases, the approved drafts are then forwarded to an expert for a blind peer review (External). The expert shall assess the drafts on various criteria, including topic relevance, comprehensiveness, original contribution to existing knowledge, language usage, and overall coherence. The resulting review report shall subsequently be shared with the respective author for their consideration.

- **4. Stage 4/Final Screening (Post Blind Peer-Review):** Once the report of External Peer Review Expert is received, the Editorial Team shall proceed as follows:
 - Acceptance by Expert: Process for final filtering and selection.
 - Rejection by Expert: Intimate the Author about rejection.
 - Revision by Expert: Intimate the author about Expert's comments and observations, and subsequent submission within 2 weeks. In case, revised draft is not received, it shall be deemed that the paper has been withdrawn by the Author.
- **5. Stage 5/Final Vetting:** The Student Committee shall forward the finalised papers to the Assistant Editors, who shall conduct the vetting of the submitted papers and highlight any formatting, citation, footnoting/reference or any other content related issues and report them to the Managing Editor for finalisation.
- **6. Stage 6/Review and Shortlisting:** The Managing Editor shall conduct a final review of the finalised papers. The review shall be exhaustive and critical. Thereafter, prepare a list of papers to be placed before the Board for final selection and publication. The list shall be submitted to the Editor-in-Chief in a sealed envelope.
- **7. Stage 7/Board Meeting and Final Selection:** The Editor-in-Chief shall convene a meeting of the Board where the final drafts approved by the Editors and Assistant Editors shall be placed for final selection and publication. The decision shall be taken by consensus. The Board may refuse to publish a paper at any stage of screening.
- **8. Stage 8/Publication:** Once the final list is prepared and approved by the Board, the Editor-in-Chief shall cause the selected papers to be published in the *HILSR L. Rev.* online.

FURTHERMORE, the whole review process may take a minimum of at least 6 to 8 months depending on the influx of submissions. The Authors will be intimated at the end of each stage if modifications are required in the original draft. In the matters of final selection and publication of paper, the decision of the Board shall be final.

FURTHERMORE, the *HILSR L. Rev.* shall follow double blind review process and the names of reviewers and authors shall not be revealed to each other, maintaining anonymity at all stages, for an objective assessment of the manuscript.

FURTHERMORE, HILSR L. Rev. shall comply with all prescribed regulations of the University Grants Commission (UGC) pertaining to academic integrity and prevention of plagiarism. All submissions shall be mandatorily checked for any form of plagiarism and similarity reports for each submission are duly generated by running them through the similarity detection software Turnitin. The similarity index/reports for each submission are generated in accordance with the University Grants Commission (Promotion of Academic Integrity and Prevention of Plagiarism in Higher Educational Institutions) Regulations, 2018 (As amended till date). For promoting integrity in research and ensuring ethical conduct of the process of publication, HILSR L. Rev. shall follow the guidelines Committee available of Publication Ethics (COPE) on at https://publicationethics.org.

FURTHERMORE, HILSR shall be the sole copyright owner of all the published materials. Apart from fair dealing for the purposes of research, private study or critique, no part of the journal shall be copied, adapted, abridged, translated or stored in any retrieval system, computer system, photographic or other system or reproduced in any form by any means whether electronic, mechanical, digital, optical, photographic or otherwise without prior written permission from the HILSR.
