The Centre is the first climate change research centre in Ireland with a core focus on humanities and social sciences perspectives. It comprises a diverse and multidisciplinary research community of over 30 faculty members and 17 PhD students across three DCU faculties.

#### Role profile

The research assistant will contribute to work on climate change and democratic governance, primarily within the context of the <u>Horizon Europe project RETOOL</u>: <u>Strengthening democratic governance for climate transitions</u>, which is coordinated by DCU. The goal of the project is to advance our understanding of how to address the twin challenges of responding to the climate imperative while strengthening and reinvigorating democratic governance. The project aims to understand how a variety of democratic institutions across Europe are responding to the climate challenge, including learning lessons from history and studying new and innovative democratic practices. The research assistant will contribute to research on institutions for deliberative participation such as citizens' assemblies, primarily in an Irish context but with the possibility of some comparative research.

The position is envisaged as an 80% Full Time Equivalent (4 days per week) position, commencing in January 2025 or as soon as possible thereafter.

## **Duties and Responsibilities**

Reporting to the Principal Investigator, the successful candidate will undertake a range of research and associated tasks within the RETOOL project. The main duties and responsibilities include:

- Undertaking literature reviews and synthesising existing research of relevance to the project;
- Undertaking primary data collection and analysis, including but not limited to document analysis and expert interviews;
- Participating in project meetings and working with partners across the project consortia;
- Contributing to engagement with relevant stakeholders;
- Contributing to the timely completion of project deliverables;
- Undertaking project management and administrative tasks as required.

#### **Qualifications and Experience**

Applicants must have a master's in environmental politics or a cognate discipline. The ideal candidate will have:

- Research experience on topics related to the intersection of climate change and democratic governance;
- Excellent empirical research, analytical, and writing skills;
- Strong interpersonal and organisational skills;

Ability to communicate effectively;

• Knowledge of the EU and Irish environmental policy landscapes.
