


LAAC'S WORK IN THE AREA OF RIGHT TO EDUCATION

One of our flagship events 'Milkar Karein RTE ko Sarthak' is organised regularly by the Committee along with the assistance from RTE officers of Jodhpur. This competition has been organised since 2018 to further the benefits under RTE ACT accessible to the target group consisting of weaker and disadvantaged sections of the society. The competition aims to bolster the impact of the beneficiary provision of Section 12(1)(c) of the RTE Act which provides for reservation of 25% seats in the private schools to realize the idea of universal education

Through this competition, our main aim is to target the masses that are not aware of their rights to secure admission in private schools and aid them in the documentation process and other technicalities required to get admissions through different teams of college students (including non-law students) under the RTE mechanism.

The team which gets the maximum number of students admitted is adjudged as the winner and are incentivized by providing an award worth Rs. 25,000. The 1st and 2nd editions of the competition were a huge success and resulted in the admission of around 265 students. We organized the 3rd edition of this competition in July 2020. As a result of it, we have submitted more than 100 admission forms for admission in private schools. We also have a review mechanism in place to ensure that even after the competition we remain in touch with the admitted children with the help of these participants so that there are no drop out from the schools.





PETITION FILED BY LAAC

The Committee further undertook a primary field survey of 107 government schools in 11 blocks of the Jodhpur District in July 2016. The findings of the same were compiled in detail in the Letter Petition addressed to the Hon'ble Chief Justice of the Rajasthan High Court, Jodhpur Bench. This Letter Petition has been treated as a Writ Petition in the public interest by the High Court in the matter of <u>Legal Aid and Awareness Committee, NLU, Jodhpur v. State of Rajasthan & </u> Ors. (D.B. Civil Writ Petition No. 6815/2017) with the latest order by the High Court directing the state government to work on bettering the infrastructure in schools and providing a report of the same to the court.

ABOUT THE EVENT

The Legal Aid and Awareness Committee of National Law University, Jodhpur, is pleased to announce the second edition of its flagship event—a paper presentation and discussion series focused on the implementation of the Right to Education Act, 2009, across different regions of India. Building upon the success of the previous edition, this event aims to provide a platform for in-depth discussions on the effectiveness of the RTE Act. LAAC has invited premier law institutes across India to participate by submitting papers through their respective Legal Aid Cells. This report will be based on surveys conducted by the participants in their regions, focusing on the current state of RTE implementation. The survey itself will be based on a recommended questionnaire issued by LAAC focusing on key indicators under the RTE Act. The submissions will be evaluated by an esteemed panel of judges from various legal fields, ensuring a high standard of academic discourse.

In addition to paper presentations, the event will also feature panel discussions led by experts in education and law. These discussions will address the challenges and shortcomings in the implementation of the RTE Act and explore possible solutions. The event aims to generate meaningful dialogue, encourage debate, and offer fresh perspectives on the ongoing efforts to realize the objectives of the RTE Act. The insights, data, and recommendations gathered from the papers and discussions will be compiled into a comprehensive RTE Research Paper. This document will be published on the National Law University, Jodhpur website, and is intended to serve as a valuable resource for policymakers, educators, and legal professionals working towards improving access to education in India.





AIMS & OBJECTIVES OF THE EVENT

The major aim of the project is to gauge the state of implementation of RTE in different states and understand the ground reality of the RTE initiative taken by the government and to assess the hindrances and incentives as to the same. Thus, it is directed towards: -

- To understand the state of implementation of RTE in India through inputs of participants and the opinions and experience of major stakeholders in RTE.
- To highlight the gaps in the Right to Education Act, 2009.
- To provide the universities and other law institutes exposure to the practical aspects of the RTE Act, as Bar Council of India mandated the implementation of the Act as part of imparting basic legal education.
- To suggest and recommend the changes if any, in the RTE Act on the basis of statistics collected.
- To enlighten the masses regarding their legal right to education.



STRUCTURE OF THE EVENT



Registration

All the interested law universities will have to register for the event by 11:59 PM on November 21st, 2024 through this link. Once the registration is completed, each participating team will be allotted a code and proper guidelines will be sent to them via official channel. Team Codes will be shared eventually.



Orientation

Following registration, the Committee will conduct a comprehensive orientation session, with dates to be announced soon. During this session, LAAC will provide essential guidelines, including a questionnaire and a sample report, and explain the structure and objectives of the competition. Participants will receive clear instructions on conducting surveys, completing the questionnaire, and preparing reports. Additionally, the Committee will offer strategies to navigate common challenges that may arise during the survey process, ensuring participants are wellprepared to contribute effectively to the event.



Survey and Report Submission

Each participating team will have to conduct an RTE survey in their respective regions through a questionnaire on the state of implementation of the RTE Act. LAAC will provide support by conducting an orientation for the participants and issuing a recommended questionnaire consisting of key indicators under the Act itself. Once the survey is completed, participating teams have to make a comprehensive report/paper on the same, making use of the data & statistics. The deadline for submission of this report and the survey statistics is at 11:59 IST January 15th, 2024 on email: nlujlaac.rtesubmission@gmail.com





Paper Presentation

After the submission of paper, a 2-day online event will be conducted from February 8, 2025 to February 9, 2025, wherein the participating teams have to prepare a presentation and 2 members from the teams will deliver it before the panel of academicians, practitioners and experts in the field of RTE through online mode. The panelists will judge the paper submitted and the presentation delivered on the basis of clarity of research objectives, depth of fieldwork, analysis quality, presentation structure, and the recommendations.



Case-Studies from the Ground

The competition will culminate in a panel discussion and problem-solving activities and case-studies based on the ground-level implementation of RTE, designed to bridge practical insights with actionable strategies. This session will feature an open dialogue between the panelists and participants, delving into the real-world challenges faced during the surveys, such as logistical and procedural obstacles, as well as broader issues impacting the ground-level implementation of the RTE Act. Participants will discuss difficulties encountered, share insights, and explore sustainable solutions alongside expert panelists. This interactive activity will also be assessed to gauge participants' problem-solving abilities and understanding of the RTE's application, offering an invaluable learning experience.





DETAILED GUIDELINES

Data Collection & Report Submission

Survey and Data Collection for the Purpose of the Report

- The teams will have to conduct the survey, include the collected data into the report and present the same before the panel of judges.
- After the closing of the registration process, a time period of about 7 weeks will be provided to the participating teams, during which the teams will have to conduct a survey based on the recommended questionnaire and prepare a report. The survey will have to be conducted in minimum 5 and maximum 15 schools.
- The survey shall be conducted on the mandated parameters and recommended questionnaire (to be submitted in a Google Form that will be shared later) provided by LAAC. The mandated parameters and a detailed questionnaire will be released by the organizing committee after the registration process is over.

Submission Guidelines

- Submissions are accepted only in the English language.
- All articles must be accompanied by an abstract not exceeding 300 words.
- The report shall be within 5000 words and must include an introduction, facts & findings of the survey, schools covered under the survey, issues in the implementation of the RTE Act, suggestions and recommendations for better implementation of the RTE Act, and a conclusion.
- The body of the manuscript should be in Times New Roman, Font Size 12, and 1.5-line spacing.
- The footnotes should be in Times New Roman, Font Size 10, and single line spacing.
- The citations must conform to the style of Bluebook (20th Edition).
- Manuscripts should only use footnotes as a means of citation. No other method shall be permitted.
- Substantive footnotes are permissible.
- A sample report will be provided by the Committee along with a questionnaire.

Submission Procedure

- The submission should be accompanied by a Covering Letter, which must include the following details:

Presentation Guidelines

- The presentation shall be organized on an online platform. (The links and details of the same will be shared later)
- Presentation shall be in English Language.
- During the presentation the camera and microphone of the speaking member should remain on. The presenters shall ensure that they are in formal attire during the course of presentation.
- Note: The organizers reserve the right to notify further guidelines or modify them at a later stage, should the need arise.





PANEL DISCUSSION

This online panel discussion and problem-solving session will gather experts, activists, educators, and policymakers to critically assess the RTE Act's implementation fifteen years since its inception. Focusing on how judicial activism, grassroots movements, and government policies have collectively impacted equitable access to education, the session aims to provide a holistic view of the RTE's reach and limitations.

Initially, the discussion will involve panelists sharing insights on the contributions and challenges posed by judicial and grassroots efforts alongside policy interventions, setting the context for real-world challenges in RTE implementation. Participants will then delve into specific obstacles—such as infrastructure deficiencies, lack of teacher training, socio-economic disparities, and systemic inefficiencies—through focused breakout sessions, each dedicated to one of these critical issues. Transitioning to a collaborative, solution-oriented dialogue, both panelists and participants will jointly propose actionable strategies to bridge the gaps identified, fostering an exchange of ideas grounded in practicality and experience. The session's ultimate goal is to empower participants with actionable solutions to implement within their communities, enabling a hands-on and impactful dialogue on bridging gaps in RTE implementation and achieving quality education for all.


