
About the Journal

SUBMISSION CATEGORIES

Articles

An Article must comprehensively analyse a specific issue. It must study or evaluate the status quo, indicate any lacunae therein, and suggest potential solutions. It may also employ a comparative, historical or multi-disciplinary approach to strengthen the author's argument.

An Article must strictly be within 6000 to 10000 word limit, exclusive footnotes and bibliography.

Essays

Essays are more concise in terms of scope and conceptualisation.

An Essay must strictly be within 4000 to 6000 word limit, exclusive footnotes and bibliography.

Case Notes and/or Legislative Commentaries

Notes and commentaries discuss or critique a recent judgement, landmark case or any recent legislation or bill before parliament or a state legislature.

A Note/Commentary must strictly be within 1500 to 3000 word limit, exclusive footnotes and bibliography.

GUIDELINES

General Guidelines

- The entries are open to all undergraduate and postgraduate students, industry practitioners, academicians and research scholars.
- Submissions may be authored, by a maximum of 2 authors.
- Each individual or team, is allowed only one submission.
- Both co-authored and single submissions will be treated as separate entries. Submissions falling into both categories will be disqualified.
- Submissions must constitute the original work of the author (s). The plagiarism limit is 10% (excluding footnotes). Any submission beyond the plagiarism limit will be disqualified.
- Each entry must be the previously unpublished work of the author (s). Manuscripts that have been published elsewhere or selected/submitted for publication elsewhere will be disqualified.
- NO part of the article should contain any form of identification of the participant, such as the author's name, university/college name, etc. Inclusion of any form of identification will result in disqualification.
- All submissions must be written in English.
- The manuscript must include an abstract, with a maximum limit of 300 words, exclusive of the overall word limit. The abstract should clearly indicate the chosen topic of the manuscript.
- Citations and footnotes must follow the Harvard Bluebook (20th edition) [LINK] referencing style.
- Avoid the use of extensive footnotes or quotations. It is acceptable to reference or paraphrase thoughts and ideas from standard works without using quotations, provided proper acknowledgement is given in footnotes or other suitable methods.
- Before being accepted for publishing in the Journal, every manuscript will undergo a double-blind, peer-review process. Failure to pass the review process will result in the disqualification of the manuscript.

Formatting Guidelines

- Abstract and Body:
 - Font: Times New Roman
 - Font Size: 12
 - Line Spacing: 1.5
- Footnotes:
 - Font: Times New Roman
 - Font Size: 10
 - Line Spacing: 1.0
- Margins:
 - All margins should be set to 1 inch or 2.54 cm on all sides.

Note: Manuscripts not following the above formatting guidelines will be disqualified.

Submission Guidelines

- Manuscripts should be emailed to <u>ilj.spilmumbai@gmail.com</u> on before 15th December 2024, 23:59 hours (IST) with the subject "ILJ Volume V Submission."
- Manuscripts submitted after the deadline will be disqualified.
- Manuscripts must be attached in either '.doc' or '.docx' format. The document must be renamed as per the chosen topic.
- Manuscripts must be accompanied by a separate document containing the following information:
 - Full Name of the Author (s)
 - Chosen Topic
 - Title of the Article
 - Name and Address of College/Institute/University

- Programme Enrolled & Current Year of Study
- Email Address & Contact Number of the Author (s)
- Full Postal Address of the Author (s)
- Brief bio of the Author (s)

Miscellaneous

- The author (s) agree to indemnify SPIL, Mumbai against all claims, suits, and damages based on allegations of copyright infringement, plagiarism, or unauthorised use.
- Any proven copyright infringement/plagiarism will result in automatic disqualification.
- SPIL, Mumbai retain the right to recall any published manuscript if it is later discovered that the submitted manuscript suffered from copyright infringement/plagiarism.
- The manuscript will be considered the property of the SPIL, Mumbai, which reserves the right to publish it as deemed appropriate.
