The 22nd session of the Jean Monnet Seminar, organised by the Jean Monnet Department of European Public Law at the University of Zagreb – Faculty of Law, will focus on the topic of “**Modern Technologies and EU Law**”. The rapid evolution of modern technologies has brought forth a multitude of implications for European Union law. This Jean Monnet Seminar delves into these dynamics, while discussing issues such as efficiency, human rights, security, market needs and competitiveness related to different EU policy areas. In this context, “modern technologies” refers to technologies which rely on AI, automated decision-making, predictive analytics and related digital technologies, as well as the application of modern technologies in science, health and other areas, which are integrated into policies and practices at the EU and Member States’ levels.

Paper proposals may cover a variety of topics exploring different perspectives and issues related to the topic of modern technologies and EU law, including but not limited to:

- EU fundamental rights
- EU migration, asylum and border controls
- EU digital single market and digital economy
 - EU security issues
 - EU health law
- EU external relations law
- EU sustainability goals
