



About the University

Kalasalingam Academy of Research and Education (KARE), formerly Arulmigu Kalasalingam College of Engineering was established in 1984 by Kalvivallal Ayya Thiru. T.Kalasaligam, a freedom fighter & philanthropist, under the trust Kalasalingam Anandam Ammal Charities. KARE is located at the pristine foothills of the scenic Western Ghats at Krishnankoil, Virudhunagar District, Tamil Nadu and it is situated near the Thirumangalam-Kollam highway (NH 744) at a distance of 65 km from Madurai and 12 km from Srivilliputtur. The college obtained the Deemed to be University status in 2006. The Institution has been serving the society for thirty-nine long years and it caters to the needs of students from all walks of society. KARE offers 35 UG programmes, 20 PG programmes and 17 Ph.D. programmes. It is the first Institution in India to introduce a special B.Tech. programme in tgineering for the differently abled (Speech and Hearing Impaired) students. The institution has been reaccredited (the third cycle) by NAAC with 'A++' grade with a CGPA of 3.56 in 2024. Also, 8 UG programmes and 3 PG programmes have been accredited by NBA under Tier-1. The UG programme of Horticulture is accredited by ICAR in 2022. KARE participates in NIRF every year and KARE has been ranked 30th in the University cadre, 36th in Engineering, 38th in Agriculture, 11-50th in Innovations and 50th in Overall categories in the year 2024. The Department of Agriculture has received the ICAR accreditation in October, 2024. KARE has received the ABET accreditation for 11 of the B.Tech. programmes in 2020. It is notable that in India, KARE is the only institution having the highest number of ABET accredited programmes.

Based on the inspections by the Ministry of Human Resources Development, Government of India, KARE has been ranked the 7th in Technical Institutions/Universities (Residential) category for Swachh Campus Ranking for the year 2018. AICTE has awarded the 3rd prize for application of Indian Knowledge System (IKS) in maintaining the campus as Clean & Smart for the year 2020. In UI Green Metric World University Ranking, KARE has been ranked 323 as theWorld's Most Sustainable University in 2023. In QS University Ranking Asia 2025, KARE has been ranked in the 521-540 band and in QS University Ranking Asia 2025: Southern Asia, KARE has secured the 148th position. In Times Higher Education World University Ranking 2025, KARE has been ranked in the band 800-1000. Considering the subject category for THE ranking 2024, KARE is at the band 501-600 under Computer Science, 601-800 under Engineering, and 601-800 under Physical Science category. KARE secured the Times Higher Education Asia University ranking 2024 in the band 301-350. KARE has also been ranked in the 251-300 band among Times Higher Education Young University 2024 (less than 50 years) category. Additionally, in THE impact ranking 2024, KARE is placed in the rank band 101 - 200 under SDG 7, 301-400 under SDG 9, 1000 + under SDG 3 and 1001-1500 under SDG 17. KARE has been securing platinum bands in the Mental Health Ranking since 2021.

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Accepted papers will be considered for publication with Taylor & Francis, Routledge.

Submission guidelines for paper to maintain the highest standards of academic integrity and quality, authors are required to follow the guidelines below for paper submission:

1. General Format

The paper must be written in English with clarity and coherence. All submissions must be in Microsoft Word (.doc/.docx) format.Font: Times New Roman, Size: 12pt for text, 10pt for references.Line Spacing: 1.5 Margins: 1 inch on all sides.

2. Length and Structure

Full-length papers: Maximum of 8–10 pages (including references, figures, and tables). Abstract: 250–300 words, clearly outlining the objectives, methods, findings, and implications. Keywords: Provide 4–6 keywords relevant to your paper. Structure: Title Page: Title, Author(s), Affiliation(s), Email ID(s). Abstract and Keywords. Introduction. Literature Review. Methodology. Results and Discussion. Conclusion and Future Scope. References (APA/MLA format as specified).

3. Figures and Tables

All figures, tables, and images must be included within the text at appropriate locations. Provide captions for each figure/table in 10 pt Times New Roman. Ensure high-resolution images (minimum 300 dpi).

4. Referencing Style

Use APA 7th Edition citation style. Ensure all references cited in the text are listed in the reference section and vice versa.

5. Originality and Plagiarism Check

Submissions must be original and not under consideration elsewhere. Plagiarism must be below 15%, excluding references and quotes. Papers exceeding this limit will be rejected.

6. Submission Platform

Papers must be submitted via the designated conference submission portal or emailed to [viscomicephss25@gmail.com]. Each submission will receive a confirmation email with a unique tracking ID.

7. Peer Review Process

All papers will undergo a double-blind peer review process. Authors may be required to revise their submissions based on reviewer feedback.
