- Challenges of bias, transparency, and accountability in AI-generated judgments.



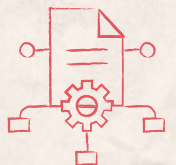
4. AI and Legal Education

Submission Guidelines

- **Abstract Submission:** Authors are requested to submit an abstract of not more than 300 words, clearly stating the research problem, objectives, methodology, and key findings.
- **Full Paper Submission:** The full paper should be between 4,000 to 6,000 words, formatted in Times New Roman, 12-point font size, 1.5 line spacing, and should follow the Bluebook 21st Edition citation style.
- **Plagiarism Policy:** All submissions must be original and unpublished work. Papers will be subject to a plagiarism check, and any submission with plagiarism above 10% will be rejected. Zero tolerance to AI plagiarism.
- **Co-authorship:** Maximum of two authors per paper is allowed.
