CONCEPT NOTE

The need for a multilayered legal framework that integrates national and international laws is critical to combat such crimes.





CONCEPT NOTE

Cybercrime legislation is evolving, yet many jurisdictions struggle to keep pace with the rapid development of digital threats, such as hacking and online fraud. Current legal provisions often inadequately address technology related fraud, highlighting the necessity for comprehensive updates to existing laws. The integration of emerging technologies into legal frameworks is crucial, as existing laws lag behind technological advancements. International cooperation and agile legislative processes are recommended to ensure laws remain relevant and effective against evolving crimes. This response is essential in addressing the challenges posed by technology, fostering further exploration of the necessity for reform in criminal law and in examining the implications for future legal frameworks.

Forensic science has the potential to enhance criminal investigations, but several challenges hinder its effective implementation. Limited funding for forensic laboratories restricts access to modern equipment and technologies, forcing many units to operate with outdated tools that compromise evidence collection and analysis. Additionally, a shortage of trained forensic professionals leads to reliance on inexperienced personnel, highlighting the need for continuous professional development especially in rapidly evolving fields like digital forensics.
