These developments are being closely examined by legal scholars, practitioners, and policymakers, particularly in relation to the principles of procedural law and fundamental rights and freedoms, including the right to a fair trial, the rule of law, the principle of equality, and the protection of personal data.

Within this framework, the international conference titled The Impact of Digitalisation on Civil Procedure aims to comprehensively address the implications of digital advancements on civil procedure law and foster discussion within a multidisciplinary platform. The conference brings together academics, practitioners, policymakers, and technology experts to collaboratively explore innovative solutions for the future of digitalised judicial processes.
