## ABSTRACT

*Topic for this Extended Abstract Competition is “AI and Platform Power: The Way Forward” for the UMLC 2025 “Challenges in a Changing World Order”. The abstract is a summary of the paper that gives readers a basic understanding of the research. The abstract should include the problem statement, research objectives, methodology, key findings, and recommendations or conclusions drawn from the study. The extended abstract should be submitted together with the full paper. While the full paper should comply with the JMLC manuscript guidelines, the extended abstract should be submitted in A4-sized paper, typed in font size 12, single-spaced, in a single column, with wide margins. The extended abstract should not exceed 1,500 words (including abstract). The necessary sections in the extended abstract comprise Introduction, Methodology, Results and Discussion, Conclusion, Acknowledgement (optional) and References. Put your abstract here. Use single spacing and do not exceed 300 words.*

*Keywords: 4 - 6 Keywords*

### **Introduction**

The introduction section should introduce the problem to be studied, briefly literature review, and provide the main findings of the work.

### **Methodology**

The methodology of the research should be clearly explained in this section.

### **Results and Discussion**

The main results of the work should be presented and discussed. Tables and figures can be used to assist with the explanation.

### **Conclusion**

Conclusions should state concisely the most important propositions of the paper as well as the author’s views of the practical implications of the results.

### **Acknowledgement (optional)**

Acknowledgement can be included in identifying the funding sources

### **References**

The references are not counted in the word limit. Proper references must be included throughout the text, and the list of references must be provided in this section. The list of references must follow the **AGLC style**.
