Citation Format: Please use footnotes rather than endnotes. Footnotes should comply with **The Bluebook: A Uniform System of Citation** (22nd Ed. 2025).

Permissible limit of Plagiarism and AI is 10% (Turnitin Report to be accompanied).

Word Limit:

- In a full-length research article, the limit is upto 5000 words.
- In a Case or Legislative comment, the limit is about 2000 words.
- These limits are inclusive of any references, tables, exhibits and appendices.
- Format: The paper shall be submitted in word document (.doc or .docx) format only.

Formatting Requirements

- The title of the manuscript must be in font size of 14; Times New Roman and the size 12 for the main text, and 10 for footnotes.
- Line Spacing must be 1.5 for main text and 1.0 for footnotes.
- Alignment must be justified.
- All text, including hyperlinks, must be in black colour only.

Originality

The submission should be original and unpublished work of the author. Publication of the same elsewhere during the process of review is to be intimated to the review and editorial committee without delay.
