Background and Rationale

Contemporary legal issues are closely linked to management, social, political, and economic factors. Therefore, incorporating multiple disciplinary perspectives into legal education and research is essential.

The proposed Capacity Building Program (CBP) aims to provide law faculty with principles and tools for integrating multiple disciplines. The program links economics, sociology, political science, history, and management with legal studies. It aligns with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, which emphasizes interdisciplinary studies, critical thinking, and innovative teaching methods.

The program seeks to advance curriculum development, foster research collaborations addressing real-world challenges from an integrated perspective, and improve academic quality by developing interdisciplinary skills.

Objectives of the Program

1. To improve the teaching and research skills of law faculty by encouraging interdisciplinary collaboration.
2. To enable participants to incorporate social science perspectives into legal studies.
3. To promote innovative teaching methods and curriculum design grounded in interdisciplinary concepts.
4. To establish frameworks for collaborative and comparative research among law and related fields.
5. To build a network of educators focused on advancing multidisciplinary legal education.6/0%

Expected Outcomes

1. Improved ability of legal educators to combine different perspectives in their teaching.
2. Creation of model interdisciplinary modules for law courses.
3. Building collaborative networks among faculty from law and related fields.
4. Greater readiness to engage in interdisciplinary research and publishing.
5. Strengthening institutional capacity to carry out NEP 2020's vision of well-rounded and multidisciplinary education.

Program Structure

- **Duration:** 7 Days (11th – 17th November 2025)
- **Focus:** Each day to be devoted to one discipline, integrating its perspectives with law.
