## About the University

## About the Seminar

Human rights are sacrosanct values that nurture the holistic development of human beings. Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR) in its article 1 says that “All human beings are born free and equal in rights and dignity,” so human rights are universal, inalienable, and indispensable for human survival and development. In the 21<sup>st</sup> century, when the world faces deepening inequalities, conflicts, and technological transformation, the importance of human rights as our everyday essentials becomes even more significant. They are not just abstract principles enshrined in only an international charter or legal framework; they manifest daily in the way individuals live, interact, and aspire towards freedom and dignity. Eleanor Roosevelt, one of the architects of UDHR, once said, “Where, after all, do universal human rights begin, in small places, close to home.” It is in these everyday spaces—our homes, schools, workplaces, and communities that the essence of human rights must live, breathe, and endure. This year's theme for International Human Rights Day 2025, declared by the United Nations, is Human Rights-Our Everyday Essential,” which emphasizes the need for protection and realization of human rights of all human beings in every walk of life.

Human rights can be understood from both national and international perspectives. At the national level, the historical moorings and cultural foundation of the society determine and shape the Human Rights framework of the country. Since the adoption of the UDHR in 1948, the dimension of human rights has evolved many folds both at the national and international levels. Many new aspects of human rights have been developed along with human progress in the world, which has also brought in new challenges for human beings in the protection of their rights. Conception and enforcement of Human Rights take place at national and international levels. At the national level in the Indian context, the origin of principle of human rights can be traced from the traditional knowledge system of Nyaya, or Ahimsa, from the Indian perspective. In global perspective, the Human Rights are particularly understood from Eurocentric perspective where the ontological basis of

Human rights is Individualism, and its perspective are determined by liberal or Marxian paradigms.

This seminar is being organised on the themes and sub-themes to deliberate, discuss the issues of Human Rights by the delegates, participants, research scholars and students.

Sub-themes of the seminar

- 1. Human Rights as Everyday Essentials:** Translating equality, dignity, and freedom into daily life across homes, schools, workplaces, and communities.
- 2. Indian Knowledge Traditions:** Exploring *Dharma*, *Nyaya*, and *Ahimsa* as indigenous foundations of human rights.
- 3. Technological Frontiers:** Addressing AI, data privacy, and surveillance as modern human rights challenges.
- 4. Economic Inclusion:** Ensuring work, social security, and non-discrimination as everyday human rights.
- 5. Environmental Rights:** Linking sustainability and climate justice to human survival and dignity.
- 6. Human Rights Education:** Promoting awareness, civic participation, and community learning for rights realization.
- 7. Intersectionality:** Examining gender, caste, disability, and identity-based barriers to human rights access.
- 8. Global Crises:** Understanding conflict, displacement, and pandemics as urgent tests of everyday human rights.
- 9. Local and Global Interplay:** Integrating Indian traditions like *Ahimsa*, *Nyaya*, and *Dharma* with global human rights norms.
- 10. Any other relevant topic.**
