CALL FOR PAPERS

The *Delhi Law Review (DLR)* [ISSN 0971-4936] is the flagship journal of the Faculty of Law, University of Delhi and is one of the oldest journals in the country, having been published since 1972. The *DLR* is an annual, double-blind, peer-reviewed journal. The *DLR* invites scholarly, original, unpublished articles, case comments/notes and book reviews for its upcoming issue Vol. 37 of 2026-2027 from academicians, judges, legal professionals and judicial officers from India and abroad on contemporary cutting-edge legal issues in the following categories:

- A. Articles (8000-10000 words, including footnotes)**
- B. Case Notes and Legislative Comments (4000-6000 words, including footnotes)**
- C. Book Reviews (1500-3000 words, including footnotes)**
- D. Translation work with critical comments (1500-3000 words, including footnotes)**

DLR primarily publishes contributions from academicians, members of the judiciary, and legal professionals. Submissions from students are considered under the separate *DLR (Student Edition)*. However, high-quality scholarly contributions from PhD research scholars may be considered on a case-to-case basis, subject to the same standards of peer review.

General Instructions

- Articles and Case Notes/Legislative Comments must be accompanied by an abstract not exceeding 200 words.
- Translations of classical works on jurisprudence, constitutional philosophy, and speeches may be considered with prior intimation to the Editors.
- All submissions must comply with the UGC Academic Integrity and Prevention of Plagiarism Regulations, 2018 (Notification No. F.1-18/2018(CPP-II), dated 23 July 2018):https://www.ugc.gov.in/pdfnews/7771545_academic-integrity-Regulation2018.pdf
- The journal may be flexible on the word limit depending on the quality of the article.
- The decision on the acceptance of the manuscript for publication rests with the DLR Editorial Board, which is final. The review process typically takes eight weeks. Only shortlisted manuscripts will be communicated further.
- Upon acceptance for publication, all rights, including copyright, in the manuscript shall vest in the Delhi Law Review. No part of the published work may be reproduced, stored, or transmitted in any form without prior written permission of the Editorial Board of the Delhi Law Review.

- Deadline for submission is **May 30, 2026**, 11:59 p.m. IST.

Format of Submission

- In accordance with the double-blind process of review, the names of the authors and their institutional affiliations must not be mentioned or indicated anywhere in the manuscript or its properties.
- The first page of the manuscript should only contain the title of the paper, followed by the abstract. The second page should commence with the main body of the manuscript.
- The main body of the manuscript should be in Times New Roman style, font size 12, with 1.5 line spacing and footnotes in Times New Roman Style, Size 10, with 1.0 line spacing. All headings must have uniform formatting.
- Texts and footnotes should conform to the ILI Rules of Citation available at: <http://www.ili.ac.in/cstyle.pdf>. *DLR* does not prefer endnotes.

Submission Guidelines

The *DLR* will only accept electronic submissions. These may be emailed to delhilawreviewdlr@gmail.com under the subject heading “DLR Vol.37 Submission”

All submissions must contain the following:

1. The manuscript in Word format (.doc or .docx) as a mail attachment.
2. PDF/other formats/hard copy submissions will not be accepted.
3. The anonymous manuscript file for review must be named “DLR Vol.37 manuscript title”, not containing the author’s name, institution, acknowledgements or any metadata with identity.
4. The body of the email must mention:
 - a) Name of the author(s)
 - b) Designation of author(s)
 - c) Institutional affiliation
 - d) Contact number
 - e) Title of the paper
 - f) A declaration to the following effect:

“I/we declare that the manuscript is an original and previously unpublished work written by me/us. “I/we undertake full responsibility for any dispute arising out of the manuscript, including but not limited to copyright infringement, defamation, or contempt.
