



**Selection Notice for Researcher  
FGV Centre for Global Law**

FGV Rio de Janeiro Law School announces the opening of the selection process for the position of Researcher of the **FGV Centre for Global Law (FGV CPDG)**, coordinated by Prof. Dr. Paula Wojcikiewicz Almeida.

FGV CPDG was launched by FGV Rio de Janeiro Law School in April 2023, with the purpose of conducting research and studies on Global Law and Governance, taking into consideration the context and the specific demands of the Global South. It contemplates transnational activities and structural links with academic institutions in Brazil and worldwide to share knowledge and develop joint endeavours and partnerships.

The headline project of the FGV Centre for Global Law is the ***Jean Monnet Centre of Excellence on EU-LA Global Challenges***, funded by the European Commission under the Erasmus+ programme, which represents the highest academic degree awarded by the European Union.

The selected candidate will work on research related to the four main research areas of the Centre: (A) International Dispute Settlement, (B) Climate Change and Forests, (C) Global Regulation, and (D) Human Rights and Democracy.

### **1. Objective**

The objective of this announcement is to organize the selection process for Researchers to the Centre for Global Law of FGV.

### **2. Summary of the position**

The position is intended for candidates who are at least pursuing a Master's degree in Law and Social Sciences. Application of candidates from different nationalities and legal backgrounds is encouraged. Researchers will work on the activities developed by the FGV Centre for Global Law, which are carried out in person at FGV Rio de Janeiro Law School's headquarters in Rio de Janeiro.

### **3. Responsibilities**

- ✓ Conducting research in international law and related topics;
- ✓ Collaborating with other researchers on multidisciplinary projects;
- ✓ Managing research projects, including developing schedules, resource allocation, and overseeing the research team;
- ✓ Analysing and interpret legal data and present results clearly and concisely;
- ✓ Contributing to academic publications and research reports;
- ✓ Participating in and organising conferences and events relevant to the field;
- ✓ Managing and disseminating projects' results in websites and social media.

### **4. Evaluation criteria**

Pre-requisites:

- ✓ Masters or Master's degree candidates or PhD candidates in Law or Social Sciences;

- ✓ Interest in conducting research in International Law and European Union Law in a multidisciplinary environment;
- ✓ Availability for in-person work;
- ✓ Availability for part-time dedication (30 hours per week);
- ✓ Fluency in English.

Differential criteria:

- ✓ Previous experience with research project management;
- ✓ Previous experience with quantitative and qualitative research;
- ✓ Fluency in foreign languages, notably Spanish and/or French;
- ✓ Multidisciplinary background;
- ✓ Ability to work with software for analysis of quantitative and qualitative data.

**5. Application and selection process**

Short-listed candidates will be invited for an interview, which may be conducted in English. Further information regarding the position will be provided in the interview.
