About the Conference

This Conference is being organized by **RC 29: Social Transformation & Development** in collaboration with **RC 03: Economy & Society**, **RC 07: Adivasi & Tribal Studies**, and **RC 31: Sociology of Sanitation** as part of the ‘Platinum Jubilee Celebration’ of the Indian Sociological Society (ISS), New Delhi in association with the Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS), that celebrates its Navati - 90th. About the Institute

Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS) was established in 1936, as the Sir Dorabji Tata Graduate School of Social Work. TISS, Tuljapur Off-Campus, was established in 1986 as its rural campus to promote sustainable, eco-friendly, and equitable socio-economic development for rural communities, with a focus on gender and social justice. TISS, Tuljapur seeks to contribute to transforming and strengthening the rural economy, society, and polity through its academic curriculum, promoting entrepreneurial activities for the holistic development of society through its undergraduate, postgraduate and doctoral programmes. The institute's initial focus on rural development projects and field action has widened to include educational activities with grassroots-level involvement by faculty and students with a four-dimensional program comprising teaching, training, field action, and research & documentation. TISS, Tuljapur Campus has begun playing a significant role not only in influencing local self-governance but also in strengthening the overall capacities of, specifically, marginalised and vulnerable communities to access educational programs, live with dignity, and participate in decision-making processes.

How to Reach TISS, Tuljapur-Off Campus



Solapur Airport is the closest, though flights operate from Solapur-Mumbai (To & Fro), twice a week (Fri & Sun). Pune Airport is the next closest to Tuljapur. From Pune to Solapur, one can travel by rail or road.



Nearest stations are Solapur (SUR) & Dharashiv (DRSV). Some major trains include Vande Bharat Express, Pune-Hyderabad Shatabdi Express, Siddheshwar Express, Udyan Express, Kanyakumari Express, Karnataka Express, Hussain Sagar, and Kurla Coimbatore Express.



State Transport buses are frequently available from Mumbai, Pune, Chhatrapati Sambhajnagar (Aurangabad), Dharashiv (Osmanabad) and Solapur cities that pass through Tuljapur. From the Solapur bus stand, there are frequent MSRTC buses that take 45-50 mins to reach Tuljapur Town.



The campus is situated on Apsinga Road, Tuljapur. One can reach the campus directly by taking a short 15-mins ride by an Auto Rickshaw from the Tuljapur State Transport (ST) Bus Depot
